Individuals are planning not only for the protection of their property, but also for the protection of individual family members. Consequently, planning for individuals takes place at a more granular level. Depending on where the individuals are located when disaster strikes, they must also plan for different locations:

Home Work Vehicle

Pets in the home will require an extension of the individual plan to consider the specific needs of each type of pet. See Pet considerations below.

The <u>type</u> of event has significant impact on your planning. Earthquakes provide NO advance warning; they simply occur. You can react to this event, but can do little to mitigate as the event occurs. Tornados often give just a few minutes' advance warning - generally enough time to seek shelter, but not enough time to evacuate. Hurricanes, wildfires, and mudslides generally provide enough advance warning so that an evacuation can occur, if it is deemed necessary. <u>Read More</u>


